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### GREAT LAKES, DORTMUNDER GOLD LAGER . . . . . 5.5

Cleveland, Ohio. Start your day with this multi-gold medal lager. Made in the true "Dortmund" German tradition, Great Lakes puts all the "big guys" to shame.

### 3 FLOYDS, GUMBALLHEAD, WHEAT ALE . . . . . 5.5

Munster, Indiana. Toasting the infamous Rob Syers comic cat, this refreshing brew has flavors of citrus and pine. Gumballhead is the rage of all the kids I know.

### ALLAGASH, WHITE WHEAT ALE . . . . . 6.5

Portland, Maine. My personal Cicerone calls Allagash White the undisputed "best" wheat beer in the United States. We love it too! This lively brew tickles our fancy. P.S. What he doesn't know is that without him, this list wouldn't be possible.

### METROPOLITAN, KRANKSHAFT KOLSCH . . . . . 6.5

Chicago, Illinois. A German style lager perfect for a sunny day. The brewmaster recommends the brew to be consumed after yoga in lawn chairs, because he hasn't tried it with a #2 prior to a Cub's game yet!

### LAGUNITAS, PILSNER . . . . . 6.5

Petaluma, California. This cold fermented Czech style pilsner is top notch in my book. Yes, I have a book. It's called "Facts on Farts" by Brenna Lorenz, so there!

### VICTORY, PRIMA PILS PILSNER . . . . . 6.5

Downingtown, Pennsylvania. Brewmaster Bill Covaleski uses whole flower German and Czech hops to produce one of our favorite dry Pils. Although how would I know? I've never been to Czechoslovakia. Have you?

### CRISPIN, DRY CIDER . . . . . 6.5

Minneapolis, Minnesota. No self-respecting St. Paul democrat can resist the temptation of this classic, hard apple cider. Fruit forward, crisp and delicious—makes you forget you lost the Lakers back in 1960.

### GOOSE ISLAND, SOFIE BELGIAN FARMHOUSE ALE 22OZ. . . . . 15.5

Chicago, Illinois. A Belgian-style farmhouse ale, brewed for the big City. Notes of orange peel, vanilla & white pepper make one wonder if Greg Hall stumbled on the recipe while preparing a sauce for duck in the dark.

### CRISPIN, HONEYCRISP CIDER 22OZ BOTTLE . . . . . 12

Minneapolis, Minnesota. Apples and honey, "This ain't Rosh Hashana." Go ahead, doll, sweeten your day. With any luck, you'll catch a little buzz and ease through the holiday.

### MAGIC HAT, #9 PALE ALE . . . . . 6.5

South Burlington, Vermont. A beer cloaked in secrecy. An ale whose mysteries swirl across your tongue, asking more questions of your palate than it easily answers. Dry, crisp—a not quite pale ale, and then.... "poof, it's gone."

### O'FALLON, WHEACH FRUIT BEER . . . . . 6.5

O'Fallon, Missouri. Our friends in Missouri have done it again. A wheat brew with peaches. Think as if you're stoned at 2 a.m. It's like Wheaties and peaches and beer. Yummmmmmm.

### TWO BROTHER'S, EBEL'S WEIS HEFEWEIZEN . . . . . 5.5

Warrenville, Illinois. Clove, vanilla & banana scent this rich Bavarian Hefeweizen. I'm just happy I don't have to wear lederhosen in Lakeview.

### GOOSE ISLAND, MATILDA PALE ALE . . . . . 8

Chicago, Illinois. Belgian style pale ale, medium body with hints of clove & orange peel. My friend, Brewmaster Greg Hall, makes lots of beer but this one's my favorite.

### FOUNDER'S, CERISE CHERRY FERMENTED ALE . . . . . 8

Grand Rapids, Michigan. Oh they win medals here my friend, and this seasonal gem made with Michigan cherries (even before they grow) gets a gold medal in magic. The brew is tart-sweet...No, scratch that—how about sweet-tart? Now that sounds catchy.

### GREAT LAKES, ELIOT NESS AMBER LAGER . . . . . 5.5

Cleveland, Ohio. A multi-gold medal winning Vienna Lager. Rich and fragrant malt flavors, balanced with crisp, Noble Hops. Naming a beer after a Prohibition cop—even a dead one, takes some balls. An average guy might get the willies.

### DOGFISH HEAD, 60 MINUTE IPA INDIA PALE ALE . . . . . 6.5

Milton, Delaware. The hophead session beer of choice for the proud Blue Hens and many locals. 60 minutes, 60 hops, 60 I.B.U., 6.0 ABV all adds up to an East Coast treasure.

### HALF ACRE, DAISY CUTTER PALE ALE . . . . . 5.5

Chicago, Illinois. A West Coast pale ale in style, made just down the block—chock-full of dark aromatic hops. A screamer, if ya know what I mean.

### STONE, IPA INDIA PALE ALE . . . . . 5.5

Escondido, California. We're excited, Stone has arrived in Chicago! A big guy in the world of craft beers, Stone sets the bar high. This IPA has been a hop head's delight since '97, where you been?

### TWO BROTHERS, DOMAINE DUPAGE FRENCH COUNTRY ALE . . . . . 5.5

Warrenville, Illinois. Caramel malt, spice & toffee. This artisan beer makes me want to go to the French countryside and one day maybe to Dupage County. *Just kidding!*

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### LAGUNITAS, IPA INDIA PALE ALE . . . . . 6.5

Petaluma, California. The original west coast India Pale Ale. A hoppy Ale celebrating the British trade routes to India. But who cares about history, sweetheart? Just pour my beer and grab me a curry puff.

### LAGUNITAS, HOP STOOPID INDIA PALE ALE 22OZ BOTTLE . . . . . 12

Petaluma, California. Homicidally hoppy and threatens to remove the rust from my pipes and yet so delicious I want to sing, "102 IBU, 102 for me & you. Let's share a beer and have some cheer, a Lagunitas for me and you!"

### TWO BROTHERS, CANE & EBEL RED RYE BEER . . . . . 6.5

Warrenville, Illinois. Piney hops & a touch of fruity sweetness from Thai palm sugar. Had Abel been able to share this fine hopped up local rye with his brother, who knows?

### STONE, ARROGANT BASTARD AMERICAN STRONG ALE 22OZ. . . . . 10

Escondido, California. To appreciate the quality and depth of this fine ale requires a level of taste and sophistication, which Stone believes you probably just don't have. Go ahead, impress us!

### NORTH COAST, BROTHER THELONIOUS BELGIAN ABBEY ALE . . . . . 8

Ft. Bragg, California. A tribute to a giant. A dark, strong, mahogany ale with rich strong flavors. Proceeds help fund the Monk Institute of Jazz at U.S.C.

### TYRANENA, ROCKY'S REVENGE AMERICAN BROWN ALE . . . . . 5.5

Lake Mills, Wisconsin. The legend of Lake Tyranena is not to be taken lightly. This ale is an offering to Rocky, the great Saurian protector of Tyranena. Aged in bourbon barrels with notes of vanilla & toast. Sounds like a treat to me

### DOGFISH HEAD, INDIAN BROWN ALE . . . . . 6.50

Milton, Delaware. 60 minute, 90 minute, who's got the time? When I'm thirsty, my fishfinder leads me to Indian Brown Ale, rich with molasses and coffee. Dry-hopped like the minute brews, you won't miss a hop.

### 3 FLOYDS, ROBERT THE BRUCE SCOTCH ALE . . . . . 6.5

Munster, Indiana. AAGH! To the Scottish King & his noble lasses. I raise my pint of ale & hope the Braveheart pays his bill. The Floyd's have outdone themselves with this rich malty brew.

### GREAT LAKES, EDMUND FITZGERALD PORTER . . . . . 5.5

Cleveland, Ohio. Another Great Lakes beer? Have we purchased stock in the brewery? On the contrary, we're just in love with these beverages brewed on the coast of picturesque Lake Erie. ### LEFT HAND, MILK STOUT . . . . . 6.5

### AVERY, OUT OF BOUNDS STOUT . . . . . 5.5

### NEW HOLLAND, DRAGON'S MILK DARK ALE . . . . . 9

Holland, Michigan. Dragon's Milk refers to the strong ales of the 17th century that only royalty were entitled to. We are proud to offer this high-gravity, whiskey barrel-aged strong ale to all who bow before us.

### DARK HORSE, RESERVE SPECIAL BLACK ALE . . . . . 6.5

Marshall, Michigan. Is it a Stout? A Porter? Nah, this black ale is just too unique. Conceived in the blistery cold of 'da U.P. but produced downstate in Marshall, Dark Horse's oldest beer has a thick presence that explodes with roasted malty goodness.
